2023-2024 University School Club Descriptions and General Information

University School offers Upper School students access to a variety of extra-curricular clubs and activities. These are administered through our Extended Day Program, and in most cases, are sponsored and supervised by University School staff and/or teachers. Clubs may have eligibility requirements as designated by the club sponsor. Club enrollment takes place online before the start of each school year, and club fees and Extended Day Program fees will be charged to students enrolled in clubs. During club meetings and activities, students are expected to behave properly, following all school rules, and showing respect for club teachers or other sponsors as well as fellow students. Students on academic probation may not participate in extra-curricular clubs. Failure to adhere to these standards may jeopardize the privilege of participating in clubs. Students absent from school because of illness or discipline are not allowed to attend an after-school club on the day of absence as well as competitions. Grades and attendance will be monitored to maintain eligibility.

General Information:

- Enrollment for clubs that do not require a tryout or application will be online, and you will receive an
 email with a link when enrollment opens. Clubs which require tryouts, or an application will not have
 online enrollment. Students will receive information about how to apply or try out after school starts
 at the first regularly scheduled club day meeting.
- Clubs require payment of a fee each semester. Each club's fee is listed with its description. For students who are not enrolled in the applicable EDP option, \$100 is added to the listed fee. For after-school clubs, the applicable EDP option is Study Hall (ends at 4:00 p.m.). For before-school clubs, the applicable EDP option is Before care (begins at 7:30 a.m.) Fees are per semester and will be billed in September and January.
- Clubs are subject to cancellation if minimum enrollment is not met and may also have limited enrollment. Spaces will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

Club Descriptions

Academic Bowl - Competition Club/Practice Club (<u>Try-outs required</u>)
Wednesday 3:15-4:15 (Practice Club) 3:15-4:30 (Competition Club)

OI-6 thru OI-8

Academic Bowl clubs are for students in 6th through 8th grade. Students who qualify will commit to weekly practices in the fall and spring. In addition, students will be expected to study outside the classroom to be prepared for common questions asked in matches. Students interested in Academic Bowl will take a written qualifying test with questions about academic trivia. Scores from the written qualifier will be used in conjunction with buzzer tryouts. Information about signing up for tryouts will be distributed to students when school starts.

Competition Club: Seventh and eighth grade students who qualify must commit to weekly practices on Wednesdays, as well as several additional evening competitions throughout the year (dates to be determined). In the spring semester, matches against area schools will take place on Wednesdays after school, and students are required to participate until the match is over, usually no later than 6:00 p.m. Additional optional practices will be added in the spring. Students are expected to attend all practices and competitions and exhibit good sportsmanship.

Practice Club: The practice club prepares 6th and 7th grade students to participate on the competition team in future years. 7th graders who do not qualify for the competition team are eligible for the practice club.

Art Club Friday - 3:15-4:30 Int. 2 thru OI-6

The purpose of this club is to extend students' love of art through the study of different artists, arts, and crafts as well as working on individual projects. We will do messy art and learn multiple different media platforms, including graphic design. Come play with art!

One team will be advanced and have tournament requirements. The other group will be a club team and have fewer requirements. Spring semester enrollment is limited to students who have been approved for spring membership by the instructor.

Odyssey of the Mind is an international educational program that provides creative problem-solving opportunities for students. They then bring their solutions to competitions on the local, state, and world level. Thousands of teams from throughout the U.S. and approximately 25 other countries participate in the program. Students are expected to attend all practices and competitions and to exhibit good sportsmanship. Students will stay until 5:00 in the spring. Applications will be available at the first OM Club meeting on Tuesday, August 22 from 3:15-4:30 and will be due by Monday, August 28.

Robotics (Application Required)

Friday - 3:15-5:00 p.m. (Fall) / 3:15-4:30 (Spring)

OI-5 through OI-8

The Robotics Club participates in the First Lego League Robotics Program. Students learn how to research, work as a team, think like engineers, and program an autonomous robot. The competition season is in the fall semester. Students enrolled in Robotics Club must be committed to attending all Friday afternoon practices. Several additional practice sessions will be held on Sunday afternoons, and students need to attend at least half of these additional meetings. Students are also expected to complete weekly homework assignments. Students will attend a regional competition in October or November, and some teams may advance to a state competition in December. In the spring semester, the club will be open to INT-2 students as well, and the fee drops to \$50. There are no competitions in the spring; students focus on programming and engineering

basics. An application and teacher recommendations will be required for membership in Robotics.

STEM Club (Application required)

Tuesday- 3:15-4:30 p.m.

Ol-7 and Ol-8 (Ol-6 by invitation only)

This club will explore science technology engineering and mathematics (STEM) topics through direct instruction

This club will explore science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) topics through direct instruction, research, experimentation, and hands-on discovery. The science topics will be focused on physics and technology and will include both hardware and software topics. Engineering will focus on mechanical and electrical principles, and mathematics will explore open-ended problems.

Specific topics of interest can be chosen by the student allowing them to focus on areas they find most interesting. This club will also benefit students' mathematics competition preparation focusing on AMC-8, Sigma Tests, and the Oklahoma Math League Competition. In addition, students will identify other competitions they would like to participate in for topics in engineering and coding. Work outside of club meeting times will be required to qualify for competitions.

Interested students will complete an application process that will include a review of recent math, science, and computer science grades and submission of an essay describing an interest in a STEM topic and why the student wants to be a member of the club. <u>Applications with more information will be available at the first club meeting August 22.</u>
